This is truly one those "once in a lifetime" trips for all ages. Family and friends are welcome. This may be the only place on earth where you can not only pet a whale, but where the mothers literally push their calves up to the surface to the skiffs. It is truly amazing. It's a 2 year cycle for the female whales. The whales begin arriving in January. They mate the first year, then the pregnant females return the following year to give birth in the calm lagoon. The nursing calves grow and get stronger for the long swim northward to the Bering Sea. Late February is when the calves are strong and very curious. That's why I have selected these dates. But as soon as the whales leave the lagoon, this behavior ends.

San Ignacio Lagoon is midway down the Baja Mexico coast on the Pacific coast side. It's very remote and undeveloped. We'll meet in Cabo San Lucas, then fly from the Los Cabo Airport (2 hour flight) and land on the lagoon's dirt runway. We will be staying at the Baja Expeditions camp. { www.Bajaex.com / www.Nautilusliveaboards.com } There are 2 camps, side by side: Glamping and Premium. Each group will fly out on a different day. These are very comfortable tents with 1 or 2 beds (not cots). Each tent has its own bathroom (flush toilet, sink, hot water shower), carpeting, heating & electricity. The Premium tents are about double the size with a couch, chairs, coffee table and more. All meals are prepared and served in a dining room with a cocktail lounge tent next door. We will watch and interact with the whales from pangas, owned and operated by the local fisherman. There are usually 6 passengers per panga, a guide and the local boat captain on each boat.
